Triad Health Project is an organization based in Greensboro and High Point, NC. It is dedicated to promoting sexual health and justice through radical care, love, and equity. The mission of the organization is to free the community from HIV, its stigma, and root causes, envisioning a future where HIV/AIDS is not a threat. The services offered include case management, higher ground day center, food pantry, education and prevention outreach, HIV/STI testing, and advocacy. THP encourages community involvement through volunteering, donations, and participation in events aimed at raising awareness and funds to support its mission. By engaging the community, THP strives to create a supportive environment where individuals affected by HIV/AIDS can live with dignity and hope. It is our goal as an organization to serve God through serving the people of High Point, by working alongside services such as the Triad Health Project.

Objective/Purpose

We began our project in prayer, by asking God to guide us on the best way to serve our community. While looking for different organizations, we were called to help those most in need; therefore, we began our search for those in the community in need. During our search we discovered that AIDS and HIV have been rising in High Point, NC which hits close to home. Triad Health Project was brought to the forefront of our thoughts, and we decided to make this place the center of our project.

Once we decided on where we wanted to serve, we reached out to Triad Health Project and acquired a list of items that were desperately needed for their food pantry. We forged an action plan on how to make the most out of the grant that we were graciously given. In receiving the Hands and Feet Grant, our CPFI chapter was able to come together in fellowship and service, by going on Amazon and to Walmart and shopping for the necessary essentials that were so desperately needed by Triad Health Project. We split the funds awarded to meet the needs of the ministry by purchasing \$250 worth of shelf-stable food, \$200 worth of hygiene products, and \$300 worth canned foods to make the most of the grant. Using the layout decided on above, we maximized our \$750 grant by using all of it, spending \$722.73 before taxes.
