What is Human Trafficking?

- Form of modern slavery
- Affects 32 million people around the world
- Fastest growing criminal industry: \$150 billion/year
- Drugs can be replaced, but people can be reused

P.A.T.H. Mission

PATH Inc. (People Against Trafficking Humans) is a not-for-profit (501c3) organization motivated by faith with a mission to end human trafficking through education, prevention and restoration. The PATH Enrichment Center is a safe place for lives to be enriched and hope to be restored through therapeutic survivor support services.

Education

- PATH is dedicated to fostering communication and cooperation between local, national and international groups that work against exploitation including partnering with the Western New York Human Trafficking Task Force

Prevention

- PATH offers preventative services for those at risk to address the issue before someone is victimized. PATH offers free weekly clinics to victims and those at risk

Restoration

- The PATH Enrichment Center located in the City of Buffalo offers therapeutic survivor support services for adults and youth who are victims of crime, assault, domestic violence, sex trafficking or labor trafficking

Results

- CEO and CMO were present when supplies were delivered
- Medical and lab equipment will last the clinic for several years and will support clinic expansion
- Approximately 240 patients per year will be impacted by these supplies who have clinic visits, but countless will be supported by the prayers from the community

How Can This Impact You?

- Provide education capacities in local communities → knowledge is power
- Invite an expert to your church and community
- Understand the dangers of the internet
- Invest in the youth and let them know that people care so they don't seek affection from a perpetrator
- Pay attention to red flags
- Report suspicious activity

Future Directions

- Medical and Pharmacy student training continuing in Summer 2025
- Future fundraising goals to buy necessary supplies for women to continue sustainable living at home
