- Founded in 1939, Southwestern Oklahoma State University's College of Pharmacy is home to a CPFI chapter, known as the Fellowship of Christian Pharmacists, that is dedicated to serving the rural community of Weatherford, Oklahoma. As students complete their professional coursework, they strive to be the hands and feet of Jesus, both inside and outside the classroom.

OBJECTIVES

- "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (English Standard Version, 2001, John 13:35)
- The 2025-2026 "Hands and Feet" projects focused on demonstrating Jesus' love by meeting people where they are. The grant helped members reach out to the Agape Free Medical Clinic patients, foster families, and Harley's House families.



METHODS



- **Blankets of Love for Agape** – The Agape Medical Clinic allowed FCP to deliver blankets and devotionals to waiting patients at their December 11th clinic.
- **Holiday Joy for Harley's House** - Families in transitional living situations received support through household essentials (such as cleaning supplies), along with items like *The Christmas Story*.
- **Morning of Play** - Children aged 6 months to 11 years enjoyed a meal and hands-on activities, including a bounce house, which gave their guardians a morning off.
