



“Sunshine Baskets ” for Domestic Violence Survivors

2026 CPFI Hands and Feet Student Chapter Grant

BACKGROUND

Fields of Hope is a non-profit Charlotte-based ministry that serves the survivors of sex-trafficking by providing safe housing, emotional support, and the resources to promote healing and independence. Fields of Hope has served over 800 survivors, has impacted and educated over 15,000 students, and reached over 40,000 people regarding awareness of sex-trafficking. The partnership between Fields of Hope and Wingate University School of Pharmacy is newly established to expand our outreach efforts and serve vulnerable populations. This initiative serves CPFI’s mission to provide compassionate, faith-based service while addressing both physical and spiritual needs. Together, this collaboration creates a meaningful opportunity to extend holistic care and empower survivors on their path to long-term recovery.

OBJECTIVES/PURPOSE

This project aimed to:

- Provide essential resources to women in recovery from trauma.
- Promote emotional, physical, and spiritual well-being.
- Demonstrate Christ’s love through compassionate outreach.
- Encourage pharmacy students to engage in faith-based service and advocacy for survivors of human trafficking and trauma.
- Expand CPFI outreach to underserved and vulnerable populations.

METHODS

- Our project used supplies from Amazon to complete the tailored “sunshine baskets.” We wanted to gather supplies that would be meaningful to the survivors with items they needed.
- Seven CPFI students at Wingate University School of Pharmacy came together to purchase, make, or deliver the baskets.
- In total, the cost was approximately \$780, primarily funded by the \$732 grant, with the remainder covered by the CPFI chapter funds.



RESULTS

- Our chapter created 6 sunshine gift baskets to give to the survivors at Fields of Hope.
- Each basket contained general personal items including socks, travel bags, and accessories while also including a bible to help each recipient grow closer to God
- Baskets were then delivered to Fields of Hope in Charlotte, NC

CONCLUSIONS

This project allowed our chapter members to tangibly apply their faith and professional identity to meet the needs of our community. This collaboration with our local domestic violence center allowed us to foster long-term relationships and future partnerships, to maximize our impact and build connections. This project was a reminder that simple acts of generosity can be powerful expressions of Christ’s love. By providing the survivor’s with essential supplies through our “sunshine baskets,” we offered support and spiritual encouragement during a time that can be very vulnerable for the survivor’s. We encourage all CPFI chapters to seek out their local domestic violence centers and see how they can best serve them.
