1 thessalonians 5:16-18

This reminder from the apostle Paul is so important this time of year. No matter what our circumstances we are told that it is God's will that we should rejoice, pray continually and give thanks. Some are experiencing the joys of an abundant harvest, while others are suffering from an economic setback. Some are experiencing the joy of a new life in their home (as we are with a new grandson), while others are struggling with the loss of their life partner or other loved one. Some are enjoying the amazing colors of the changing seasons, while others are struggling to find food and warmth in the midst unusual record cold and snow falls. We all have seasons where we may go from one extreme to the next, and sometimes it is not even seasons, but we see these changes all within a day, but the instruction is clear. It is God's will that we rejoice at all times, that we continue to be in prayer about our circumstances and we give thanks that God is in charge.

It is not easy to do this especially when the circumstances we are facing are unpleasant. Paul actually had advice on that too. It is good to be praying for our circumstances, but it is encouraging to be praying to together with someone. To give thanks with others is a way to experience strength. So this Thanksgiving, whatever your circumstances I challenge you to find someone that you can rejoice with, pray with and lift your voices together in thanksgiving.

This year at the Board meeting we had the opportunity to review reports from the standing committees and address any issues related to their activities. Our discussions and actions focused on three main areas:

- **Finances** we reviewed our finances for the past year. We should be finishing the year in the black because our investments have performed well this year.
